Dominant discussions have argued for the significant impact of financialisation of the global economy in re-shaping workplaces. In this context, labour, work and employment dynamics need to be complicated by exploring the experiences of individuals and organizations. The workshop will showcase theoretical, conceptual and empirical contributions by scholars in the field of business and management studies to enhance our understanding of these issues.

The workshop seeks to act as a multidisciplinary forum for discussion of contemporary features, trends and developments about labour, work and employment. We invite contributions in the following themes:

- Globalization and international dimensions of work
- The role of institutions in labour, work and employment dynamics
- Professions and careers in the global(ised) economy
